7. Innovations and Best Practices

7.1 Innovations introduced during this academic year which have created a positive impact on the functioning of the institution. Give details.

Creation of a fish pond with African cat fish for disposal of food waste generated in the college.

The CARE, SHARE and LEARN was undertaken as a five year programme by the college. As a initial step a survey was conducted by the students to find the status of each family in the adopted ward of Manarcad grama panchayath. A LED bulb making class was also organised.

7.3 Give two Best Practices of the institution (please see the format in the NAAC Self-study Manuals)

1.CARE, SHARE AND LEARN

Objective: To adopt a ward of Manarcad grama panchayath and conduct a survey to access the needs of the families of this ward.

Context and practice: Once the data about the number of families and their needs are identified the resources and manpower of the college can be utilized for the upliftment of the community.

A drawback of the present higher education scenario is that students are not aware of the needs of the community in which they reside. This project will involve the students to do something that will enhance their communication skills as well as expose them to the problems faced by the community.

Evidence of success: A detailed survey of the panchayath was carried and the data collected was analysed. This project created a platform for greater interaction of the students with the community.

2. SPECIAL COACHING

Objective: To conduct special classes for weak students in various subjects to improve their performance in the University examinations.

Context and practice: Special classes were arranged for UG students who were interested in subjects that were difficult for them like Mathematics and English. Since the college is situated in a rural area most of the students find it difficult to write and communicate in English. An external teacher was arranged for maths classes and the classes were conducted after regular working hours. Classes were also arranged in other subjects that the students requested. These classes were engaged by the faculty of the college itself.
